YOU MUST PROPERLY HANDLE THIS FIREARM AT ALL TIMES. IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO MAKE SURE THAT ALL SAFETY MEASURES ARE TAKEN.



YOU MUST ALWAYS SECURE THIS FIREARM AWAY FROM CHILDREN AND PERSONS WHO ARE NOT PERMITTED TO USE THIS FIREARM. YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR SAFELY STORING THIS FIREARM IN ACCORDANCE WITH ALL APPLICABLE LAWS. AT A MINIMUM, YOU MUST PROPERLY LOCK THIS FIREARM AND ENSURE THAT CHILDREN AND UNPERMITTED PERSONS CANNOT ACCESS THIS FIREARM.

ALWAYS POINT THIS FIREARM IN A SAFE DIRECTION. NEVER POINT THIS FIREARM AT ANY PART OF A PERSON'S BODY OR AT ANY PART OF YOUR BODY. YOU MUST TAKE THIS INTO ACCOUNT WHEN YOU ARE HANDLING THIS FIREARM, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO WHEN YOU ARE LOADING, UNLOADING OR FIRING THIS FIREARM. FAILURE TO DO SO COULD RESULT IN SERIOUS INJURY OR DEATH. A SAFE DIRECTION IS A DIRECTION THAT WILL NOT ALLOW A DISCHARGED BULLET TO HIT A PERSON DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY (E.G. RICOCHETING).



YOU AND ANY PERSON HANDLING THIS FIREARM MUST BE COMPLETELY FAMILIAR WITH SAFE HANDLING PROCEDURES AND HOW THIS FIREARM OPERATES BEFORE HANDLING IT. FAILURE TO DO SO COULD RESULT IN THE ACCIDENTAL DISCHARGE OF A BULLET OR OTHER COMPONENT CAUSING SERIOUS INJURY OR DEATH OR DAMAGE TO PROPERTY.



WHEN STORING YOUR FIREARM, NEVER STORE AMMUNITION IN THE SAME LOCATION AS YOUR FIREARM.



NEVER PUT YOUR FINGER OR ANY OBJECT ON THIS FIREARM'S TRIGGER OR TRIGGER GUARD UNLESS YOU INTEND TO FIRE.



YOU MUST ALWAYS BE ABLE TO CLEARLY SEE AND IDENTIFY YOUR TARGET. YOU MUST ALWAYS KNOW WHAT IS AROUND AND BEYOND YOUR TARGET. You must always know exactly where your bullet is going to strike, even when dry firing. You must only shoot where there is a backstop free of obstructions. Do not shoot in the air. Do not aim at objects that may cause the bullet to ricochet, such as water, rocks and hard surfaces. When hunting you must always be able to clearly see and identify your target: do not fire at a movement or a noise.



DO NOT RUN, JUMP, CLIMB, HORSEPLAY OR ROUGH HOUSE WHILE CARRYING THIS FIREARM.



KEEP YOUR FACE AND HANDS AWAY FROM THE BOLT CARRIER WHEN FIRING. THE BOLT CARRIER OPENS AND CLOSES RAPIDLY WHEN FIRING. HOT BRASS AND POWDER GAS CAN EJECT AND BURN YOU.

ALWAYS USE THE CORRECT AMMUNITION FOR THIS FIREARM.
NEVER USE AMMUNITION THAT HAS BEEN "HANDLOADED", IS NONSTANDARD, RELOADED, OR HAS NOT BEEN TESTED AND SUBJECTED TO
BALLISTIC PRESSURE TESTING.



ALWAYS WEAR SHOOTING SAFETY GLASSES AND EAR PROTECTION WHEN HANDLING THIS FIREARM, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO WHEN YOU ARE ASSEMBLING, DISASSEMBLING, CLEANING, TRANSPORTING OR FIRING THIS FIREARM OR ANY ACCESSORIES FOR COMPONENTS TO THIS FIREARM. ANY OTHER PERSONS NEARBY MUST WEAR SAFETY GLASSES AND EAR PROTECTION AS WELL.



YOU MUST CHECK THE BARREL FOR OBSTRUCTIONS BEFORE FIRING THIS FIREARM. COMMON OBSTRUCTIONS INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO MUD, SNOW, AND ANY OTHER OBJECT WHICH MAY HAVE ACCIDENTALLY BEEN PLACED IN THE BARREL. OBSTRUCTIONS IN THE BARREL CAN CAUSE DAMAGE TO THIS FIREARM AND COULD CAUSE SERIOUS INJURY OR DEATH TO YOU OR OTHERS. DO NOT LOOK UP THE MUZZLE TO CHECK THE BARREL.



ANY ACCESSORIES USED IN OR ON THIS FIREARM MUST BE COMPATIBLE WITH TROY'S SPECIFICATIONS; THIS INCLUDES HOLSTERS AND GRIPS. You must make sure that any compatible accessories for this firearm do not hinder the use of any of the safety devices.



IF THIS FIREARM IS DROPPED OR STRUCK WHILE LOADED IT MAY DISCHARGE. ALWAYS KEEP THIS FIREARM UNLOADED AND THE CHAMBER EMPTY UNTIL YOU INTEND TO FIRE IT.



ALWAYS REMOVE ANY MAGAZINE AND AMMUNITION FROM THIS FIREARM'S CHAMBER WHEN YOU HAVE FINISHED SHOOTING. After shooting this firearm for a sustained period of time, "cook-off" can take place. "Cook-off" is when the firearm remains at an excessively high temperature, potentially causing ammunition in the firearm to inadvertently discharge. This can occur for an extended period of time even after you have stopped firing this firearm.

SAFE HANDLING AND OPERATION (CONTINUED)



BE SURE THAT ADEQUATE VENTILATION IS ALWAYS AVAILABLE. WHEN USING FIREARMS IN AN AREA THAT IS NOT WELL VENTILATED, LEAD EXPOSURE AND EXPOSURE TO OTHER HARMFUL SUBSTANCES MAY OCCUR. EXPOSURE TO LEAD CAN CAUSE BIRTH DEFECTS, REPRODUCTIVE HARM, AND OTHER SERIOUS PHYSICAL ALIMENTS TO YOURSELF OR OTHERS.





YOU MAY ONLY USE THIS FIREARM FOR LAWFUL PURPOSES.

SAFE STORAGE AND TRANSPORTATION

WHEN TRANSPORTING THIS FIREARM YOU MUST MAKE SURE THAT IT IS UNLOADED. YOU MUST MAKE SURE THIS FIREARM IS UNLOADED BEFORE BEING PLACED IN A VEHICLE. A FIREARM CARRYING CASE SHOULD BE USED TO TRANSPORT THIS FIREARM TO AND FROM A SHOOTING AREA.



: YOU MUST ALWAYS SECURE THIS FIREARM AWAY FROM CHILDREN AND PERSONS WHO ARE NOT PERMITTED TO USE THIS FIREARM. YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR SAFELY STORING THIS FIREARM IN ACCORDANCE WITH ALL APPLICABLE LAWS. FIREARM. Never store this firearm in a leather case or anywhere it may be exposed to moisture. Moisture can damage this firearm.

AMMUNITION



ALWAYS USE THE CORRECT AMMUNITION FOR THIS FIREARM.

NEVER USE AMMUNITION THAT HAS BEEN "HANDLOADED", IS NON-STANDARD,
RELOADED, OR HAS NOT BEEN SUBJECTED TO BALLISTIC PRESSURE TESTING.

USING THE WRONG AMMUNITION, INCORRECT CARTRIDGE COMPONENTS, OR
BORE OBSTRUCTIONS CAN CAUSE DEATH OR SERIOUS INJURY TO YOU OR
OTHERS. In all cases, wear safety glasses and hearing protection designed for firearm
use.

Review the caliber of the firearm and only use that caliber Ammunition. Never mix ammunition. Ammunition that is not designed for this firearm may rupture, causing serious injury or death to you or others.

Always check your ammunition to be sure that it is not dirty, damaged or corroded which may cause it to rupture, causing serious injury or death to you or others and/or damage to this firearm.

The firearm was designed to use brass cased ammunition. Using other types of casings can cause malfunctions and may damage the rifle.

FUNCTIONAL INSPECTION



ALWAYS WEAR SAFETY GLASSES WHEN INSPECTING THIS FIREARM



WHEN INSPECTING THIS FIREARM, ALWAYS MAKE SURE THAT IT IS UNLOADED. THIS MEANS THAT THE BOLT IS LOCKED OPEN, THE CHAMBER IS CLEAR, THE BARREL IS CLEAR AND THE MAGAZINE IS EMPTY.



WHEN INSPECTING THIS FIREARM, ALWAYS POINT THE MUZZLE IN A SAFE DIRECTION. DO NOT PUT ANY PART OF YOUR BODY IN FRONT OF THE MUZZLE. DO NOT PUT YOUR FINGERS OR ANY OBJECT ON THE TRIGGER.



DESCRIPTION AND OPERATION



BEFORE USING A FIREARM. READ AND FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS

IF THERE IS ANYTHING YOU DO NOT UNDERSTAND, GET HELP FROM
SOMEONE QUALIFIED IN THE SAFE HANDLING OF FIREARMS.
ORSERVE SAFE FIREARM HANDLING PRACTICES AND WEAR SAFETY GLASSES AT ALL TIMES.

OPERATING THE SAFETY SELECTOR



ALWAYS BE SURE THAT THE SAFETY IS COMPLETELY "ON" UNLESS YOU ARE ACTUALLY FIRING. NOTE: EVEN IF THE SAFETY IS ON, THIS FIREARM MAY STILL DISCHARGE. YOU MUST ALWAYS TREAT THIS FIREARM AS BEING LOADED. THIS MEANS YOU SHOULD NEVER POINT A FIREARM IN AN UNSAFE DIRECTION.





When operating this firearm you must be aware of the safety selector mechanism, located on the left and right of the lower receiver. The safety feature is set "on" when the safety selector is pointing forward toward the word "SAFE" on the firearm. The safety feature can be engaged whenever the hammer is cocked. When the safety is placed on "SAFE", it blocks the trigger. Whenever you are loading or unloading the firearm you should always set the safety selector to "SAFE".

LOADING YOUR FIREARM WITH A MAGAZINE



ALWAYS USE THE CORRECT AMMUNITION FOR THIS FIREARM.
NEVER USE AMMUNITION THAT HAS BEEN "HANDLOADED", IS NONSTANDARD, RELOADED, OR HAS NOT BEEN TESTED AND SUBJECTED TO
BALLISTIC PRESSURE TESTING. THE USE OF THE WRONG AMMUNITION,
INCORRECT CARTRIDGE COMPONENTS, OR BORE OBSTRUCTIONS CAN
CAUSE DEATH OR SERIOUS INJURY TO YOU OR OTHERS.



NEVER USE MAGAZINES THAT ARE NOT STANDARD, DAMAGED, DISASSEMBLED, ALTERED, MODIFIED OR HAVE BEEN ASSEMBLED IN AN IMPROPER FASHION. Doing so can cause a malfunction to take place.



Always place bullets into the magazine from the top. Place bullets down onto the follower and depress until the feed lip holds the bullets. Continue to load until the desired amount of bullets is placed into the magazine.

When inserting the magazine, place the top part of the magazine into the magwell and slide it all the way up. Always be sure to check that the magazine is fastened securely in place.



To remove the magazine from this firearm, depress the magazine catch button. Pull the magazine out of the magwell. Do not let the magazine fall and hit the ground because that can cause damage to the magazine.



SAFE FIRING



THIS FIREARM IS ABLE TO FIRE WHEN THE MAGAZINE IS REMOVED. IF THE MAGAZINE IS REMOVED AND A ROUND IS IN THE CHAMBER, THE ROUND WILL BE FIRED WHEN THE TRIGGER IS PULLED. ALWAYS KNOW IF THERE IS A LIVE ROUND IN THE CHAMBER AND ALWAYS POINT YOUR FIREARM IN A SAFF DIRECTION.

Make sure that you fully understand the important aspects of handling this firearm and be sure that you can operate the functions with skill and confidence through practice with an unloaded firearm.

Always make sure the rifle muzzle is pointed in a safe direction.





Move the safety to the "SAFE" position, depress the manual bolt release button to open the action.



Insert a magazine, with the desired amount of rounds, into the magazine well. Depress the bolt release button and move the forend forward into the closed battery position chambering a live round as it does.



AT THIS POINT, THE FIREARM IS COCKED AND LOADED WITH A ROUND IN THE CHAMBER. AT THIS POINT YOU SHOULD MAKE SURE THAT THE SAFETY SELECTOR IS STILL ON "SAFE", AND KEEP THE FIREARM POINTED IN A SAFE DIRECTION.



Grip the handguard of the firearm with one hand and grasp the grip with your other hand making sure to rest your index finger on the outside of the trigger guard. Raise the firearm and place the buttstock into your right shoulder.



Visually locate a safe target. Once you have identified a safe target, aim your firearm at it. At this point, turn the safety selector switch from "SAFE" to the "FIRE" position. When the target is properly aligned in your sights, steadily squeeze the trigger until a round is fired.



WHEN FIRING, KEEP YOUR FACE AND HANDS AWAY FROM THE BOLT CARRIER. HOT BRASS AND POWDER GAS CAN EJECT AND BURN YOU. THE RIFLE, AS ASSEMBLED, SHOULD BE FIRED FROM THE RIGHT SHOULDER. NOTE THAT THE BUTTSTOCK CAN BE RECONFIGURED FOR LEFT-SIDE FOLD AND LEFT SHOULDER USE. THIS RECONFIGURATION IS EXPLAINED, IN DETAIL. LATER IN THIS MANUAL.



SHOOTING SAFETY GLASSES AND HEARING PROTECTION SHOULD BE USED WHEN FIRING.

To fire the next round, you will need to extract the spent cartridge and load another round into the chamber from the magazine. To do so, open and close the action swiftly by pumping the forend rearward and again forward. Identify a safe target. Then, pull the trigger.





ALWAYS REMOVE ANY MAGAZINE AND AMMUNITION FROM THIS FIREARM'S CHAMBER WHEN YOU HAVE FINISHED SHOOTING. AFTER SHOOTING THE FIREARM FOR A SUSTAINED PERIOD OF TIME, "COOK-OFF" CAN TAKE PLACE, WHEN THE FIREARM IS AT AN EXCESSIVELY HIGH TEMPERATURE, POTENTIALLY CAUSING AMMUNITION IN THE FIREARM TO INADVERTENTLY DISCHARGE. THIS CAN OCCUR FOR AN EXTENDED PERIOD OF TIME EVEN AFTER THE WEAPON FIRING HAS CEASED.



IF THIS FIREARM IS DROPPED OR STRUCK, THE RIFLE MAY DISCHARGE. ALWAYS MAKE SURE THE FIREARM'S CHAMBER IS EMPTY UNTIL YOU ARE READY TO SHOOT.

UNLOADING

Keep the firearm pointed in a safe direction and set the firearm safety selector to the "SAFE" position.



Depress the magazine release button and remove the magazine.



Push up on the manual bolt release button, pull back on the forend all the way to the rear of the firearm to extract any remaining round or spent cartridge from the chamber.

CLEARING MISFIRES

In the event your chambered round fails to fire, keep the muzzle pointed in a safe direction, push the safety lever forward into the "SAFE" position and wait for at least 30 seconds.

Keep your finger out of the trigger guard.

Depress the magazine release button and remove the magazine.

Depress the manual bolt lock.

Pull back on the forend all the way to the rear and eject the misfired round from the chamber. Remove the rear takedown pin by pushing it out to the right. Tilt the upper receiver barrel assembly upward, away from the lower receiver. NEVER LOOK DOWN THE BARREL FROM THE MUZZLE END. Only after the chamber has been visually checked and cleared should the weapon be reassembled and reloaded.

If a casing or unfired round will not extract, contact a qualified armorer or gunsmith.

CLEARING BORE OBSTRUCTIONS



MAKE SURE THERE ARE NO BARREL OBSTRUCTIONS BEFORE FIRING THIS RIFLE. CHECK THE BARREL FOR ANYTHING THAT MAY BE OBSTRUCTING THE BARREL OR THE MUZZLE, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO MUD, SNOW, WATER, OIL AND GREASE AND ANY OTHER OBJECT WHICH MAY HAVE ACCIDENTLY BEEN PLACED WITHIN THE BARREL. BARREL OBSTRUCTIONS CAN CAUSE DAMAGE TO THE FIREARM AND COULD CAUSE INJURY OR DEATH TO YOU OR OTHERS.

If you believe that your firearm may have an obstruction or has been exposed to humid conditions, visually check to see that the barrel chamber and bore have no obstructions. NEVER LOOK DOWN THE BARREL FROM THE MU77LE END!

In the event a bullet becomes lodged inside of the bore, perform the following instructions:

- 1. Remove the magazine from the firearm.
- 2. Pull the forend rearward extracting the spent cartridge from the chamber.
- 3. Remove the rear takedown pin by pushing it out to the right.
- 4. Tilt the upper receiver barrel assembly upward, away from the lower receiver.
- 5. Visually check to see that the barrel chamber and bore have no obstructions. NEVER LOOK DOWN THE BARREL FROM THE MUZZLE END. Only after the chamber has been visually checked and cleared should the weapon be reassembled and reloaded.

You may try to dislodge the bullet from the bore with a cleaning rod that does not have a tip or brush. If this does not work, take the firearm to your local authorized gunsmith. DO NOT try to dislodge the bullet with anything that is not authorized for removals of bore obstructions.

Thoroughly check the bore once more to be sure it is clean of obstructions and debris

DISASSEMBLY - PUMP ACTION



KEEP THE MUZZLE POINTED IN A SAFE DIRECTION.



ALWAYS WEAR FIREARM SPECIFIC SAFETY GLASSES
WHENEVER YOU ARE ASSEMBLING OR DISASSEMBLING YOUR FIREARM.



NEVER DISASSEMBLE THIS FIREARM BEYOND THE INSTRUCTIONS IN THIS MANUAL.

Make certain that the magazine is removed and that the firearm is not loaded.

Make sure the weapon is on "SAFE."



Push in the rear take down pin on the left side of the lower receiver. Pull the pin from the right side until the detent stops completely.





Pivot the upper receiver on the front pivot pin away from the lower receiver



With pump grip all the way back, press down through hole with a pointed object such as a bullet tip on the pump-rod lock.





While holding pressure on the pump-rod lock, reach in with finger and push back on bolt face until it slides rearward.



Release pressure on pump-rod lock and remove the bolt carrier assembly.





WHENEVER YOU ARE ASSEMBLING OR DISASSEMBLING THIS FIREARM OR COMPONENTS, PARTS OR ACCESSORIES TO THIS FIREARM, ALWAYS WEAR SAFETY GLASSES SPECIFIED FOR FIREARMS.

To remove the pump-rod, grab hold of it, rotate clock-wise and slide forward.



Remove the cotter pin.



Remove the firing pin.



Remove the cam pin.



Remove the bolt.



Be sure to lubricate metal parts of your firearm inside and out with CLP lubricant. You can do so by using high quality gun oil but be sure to remove excess, leaving only a light layer.

Assemble the firearm by reversing the disassembly procedure.

SIGHT INSTALLATION

Unscrew the sight base clamp from the sight base



Place the sight base and sight base clamp onto the rail and hold tightly together. While still clasping, use a drop of thread locking compound while you tighten the screw to fasten the sight to your rifle. (Note: Sight should fold to rear of rifle).

Sight Function Flip up: Push the release button on the left side to the right, releasing the sight, allowing it to flip up into the vertical position.

Sight Function Fold down: Press and hold the button located on the left of the sight and fold the sight down, then release the button.

FOLDING BUTTSTOCK OPERATION





Lift up on the buttstock lightly and fold out.





Make sure the button works around the latch once folded.

Rotate lever counter clockwise and extend stock to the desired position.

Release the lever and push or pull the stock to make sure it locks in place.

Rotate the lever and push stock to full collapse.

Press on the stock button and fold the stock until it touches the receiver.

Put light pressure on the stock, push in and release.

The stock will settle down over the pin and stay locked.

FIXED BUTTSTOCK INSTRUCTIONS

To install:

Open storage compartment by depressing latch on buttplate with bullet tip or other tool.

Push button located in the buttstock buffer tube chamber with finger.

Slide stock on buffer tube.







Operation: To open/access storage compartment:

Depress latch on buttplate with bullet tip or other tool. Compartment will open and allow for storage.





Operation: To adjust stock:

Depress bottom lever.

Slide stock to desired length.



CLEANING AND UPKEEP



Prior to cleaning, be absolutely sure that this firearm is completely safe. This means that your firearm is unloaded and safe before attempting to clean it. Whenever your firearm has been fired or exposed to the elements or any sorts of debris including sand, dirt, water, dust, humidity, or any other harmful elements or harmful conditions, you should clean it.



Wear safety glasses when cleaning this rifle.

- 1. Disassemble vour rifle
- Use a bore cable or cleaning rod with a solvent wetted patch to remove any excess grease and debris from the bore. Repeat as necessary.
- Use a bore cable or cleaning rod with dry patches to dry the bore.Run a powder solvent to remove any excess residue from the bore and exterior of the firearm.
- Run another dry patch through the bore and then push or pull a lightly oiled patch through the bore.
- 5. Wipe down the rest of the rifle with a lightly oiled patch.

LAW ENFORCEMENT AND MILITARY PERSONNEL SHOULD CONTACT THEIR DEPARTMENTAL ARMORER WHO WILL INSPECT THE FIREARM ON A YEARLY BASIS.
